

### Graduate Student Network Listserv

This list is the communication mechanism for the Graduate Student Network (GSN) of the International Association for Research on Service-Learning and Community Engagement (IARSLCE). This listserv provides a forum for the discussion of issues concerning graduate students of the service-learning and community engagement community. We encourage you to use it to communicate and share resources with other graduate students interested in research on community engagement, service-learning, and related topics. GSN discussions can evolve around methodological approaches, best practices, dissertation and thesis writing, announcing fellowships, graduate assistantships, and professional positions, grants supporting graduate student research and professional development, publishing inquiries, curriculum requests, class assignments, the institutionalization of service-learning, and general advice and guidance for the field.

The GSN listserv of IARSLCE is open to any graduate student who expresses interest in the field. Membership of the GSN listserv is open to both members and non-members of IARSLCE in order to expand the network and increase access to resources, input, and feedback among graduate students in the field.

### **Policies**

- **What is an email discussion list (listserv)?** An email discussion list is an electronic discussion group that meets over e-mail. Email discussion lists provide a place to ask questions, post information, and share ideas and resources with peers via e-mail. Once subscribed to a list, messages can be sent through the email discussion lister to all the other subscribers.
- **Use Guidelines**  
This email discussion list is not moderated. Anyone who subscribes may post messages. Inappropriate postings include advertising of fee-based services or products, chain letters, and jokes. Fellowship, assistantship, and job announcements are permitted.
- **Disclaimer**  
Inclusion of information in an email discussion list message should not be construed as an endorsement by the IARSLCE of that information, the person submitting it, or the material submitted. Opinions or points of view expressed in an email discussion list message are those of the contributor and do not necessarily reflect those of the IARSLCE. Also, IARSLCE cannot guarantee the relevance, timeliness, or accuracy of information contained in web sites that are cited in an email discussion list message.
- **Regarding Copyright**
- The text of a copyrighted article or document may not be reprinted on an email discussion list or website without the permission of the author or the publisher. If one has permission, it should be stated: "This article has been reprinted with the permission of ..." Or, rather than reprinting an article that is available on-line, consider posting a brief abstract and a link to the site. Even when a document is in the public domain or only a small portion is being reproduced, it is a professional courtesy to cite the source.
- **Advertising Prohibited**
- Commercial advertising on IARSLCE-sponsored email discussion lists is prohibited. Commercial advertising by vendors and other subscribers on IARSLCE-sponsored email discussion lists is defined as posting messages the principal purpose of which is to promote, directly or indirectly, goods or services offered in exchange for money, goods, or services. Inappropriate messages may include, but are not limited to, those that include promotional announcements, product-related press releases, pricing information, or specific referrals to websites or other media to complete sales transactions. While vendors may respond privately or publicly to postings inquiring about or pertaining to products and services that they offer, their public responses cannot violate the terms in this email discussion list policy. Unsolicited messages containing vendor or product information should not be posted.
